- To form a network of informed, concerned citizens who can help guide the future of our community.
- To strengthen leadership abilities by interacting and learning from other leaders.
- To educate and motivate leaders to greater involvement in the community.

SELECTION AND TUITION

APPLICATIONS

Anyone engaged in a career or other endeavors and having an interest in community development and growth is invited to apply.

SELECTION

Candidates will be selected with a view toward establishing a diverse mix of ages, professions, activities and outlooks as evidenced on the applications. Class size is limited! You will be notified of your acceptance into the program in mid-August.

TUITION- \$895.00

Your tuition fee is due upon notification of selection. This fee covers the costs of the beginning retreat, graduation event, meals, materials and group transportation (carpooling from our starting location is recommended for most sessions- buses and vans will be provided as needed).

ATTENDANCE

Leadership Hillsboro consists of nine sessions, including the retreat. ***Participants may not be absent more than two times.*** Any portion of a missed day will be considered a full absence. It is vital for both the individual and the class that each member be present to add his or her perspective.

METHOD

Approximately 30 Hillsboro leaders will begin their experience with an all-day retreat in September. This will be followed by eight all-day sessions: one each month October through May. A graduation event and the Community Service Day in early June will tie together the entire year.

Graduates of this class will then be responsible for organizing next year's sessions.

Retreat- Attendance at the September 11th retreat is mandatory.

BEGINNING RETREAT/ ORIENTATION WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2019

An overview of the program in a retreat setting. The focus of the day is to establish networking within the group, to develop communication skills and to explore leadership dynamics. **THIS SESSION IS MANDATORY FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS.**

TRANSPORTATION, LAND USE & PLANNING WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2019

The first program day presents an overview of where we work and live. Get a birds-eye view of Washington County along with an in-depth discussion of land use planning and transportation presented by city and county officials.

ENVIRONMENT, HISTORY & AGRICULTURE WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 13, 2019

Washington County is among the state and national leaders in nursery production and has a growing number of acres planted for the wine industry. We will learn more on the history of our county's agricultural base as well as discovering the actions being taken to preserve our resources and quality of life.

BUSINESS & INDUSTRY WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 11, 2019

A study tour of the economic/employment climate of Washington County, industrial planning and development, what makes business work and how our community remains economically strong.

GOVERNMENT/JUSTICE SYSTEM WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 8, 2020

An examination of local and county government as well as education regarding operation and structure of the justice system. This day typically includes a tour of the Washington County jail.

EDUCATION

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2020

This day is dedicated to the future of our area- our children. Get a look at how our children are being educated, the curriculum and the challenges educators face with increasing academic standards in today's budget-conscious world.

Any portion of a missed day will be considered a full absence. Anyone missing more than 2 sessions will not be recognized as a Leadership Hillsboro graduate. The second year will consist of assisting with the preparation and presentation of the Leadership Hillsboro program for the class of 2020-2021.
