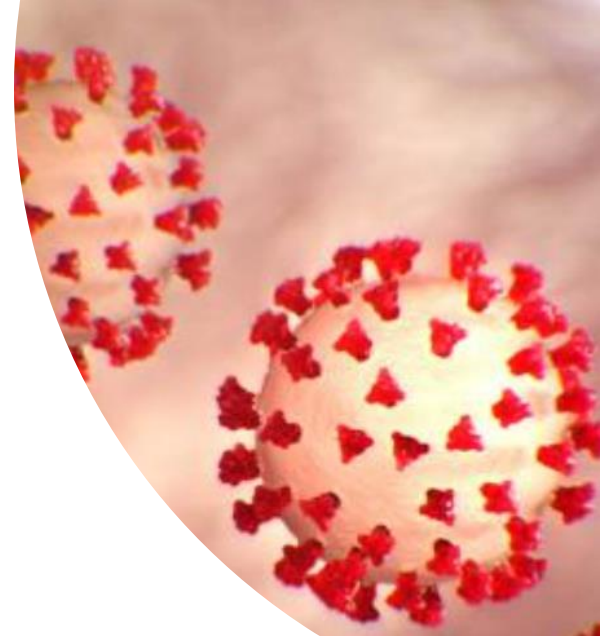

Reopening Phases

Baseline

- Retail
- Take out restaurant service
- Childcare
- Summer camps and summer school
- Outdoor recreation

Phase 1

- Restaurants, bars, breweries, brewpubs, wineries, tasting rooms and distilleries
- Personal services
- Gyms
- Malls
- Gatherings of 25 or less

Phase 2

- To be determined
- Possible increase in gathering size
- Possible increased work in offices
- Possible limited visitation to nursing homes

Phase 3

- Possible increase in gathering size
- Concerts, festivals, live audience sports not open until reliable vaccine or treatment

Reopening the County

- Currently in "Baseline" (pre-phase 1)
- Must meet 7 criteria
- Progress

Guidance Themes

- Employees must wear face coverings
 - Employers must provide face coverings
- Encourage customers to wear face coverings
- Post signs/posters (<https://govstatus.egov.com/OR-OHA-COVID-19>)
- Extensive hand washing and cleaning procedures
- 6 feet of distance



Guidance Highlights

- Personal Services
 - Appointment Only
 - Pre-appointment health check
 - Maintain a customer log
 - 6 feet of distance between clients
 - Clients and staff must wear face covering
 - Remove all magazines, newspapers, snacks and beverages from waiting areas

Guidance Highlights Cont.

- Restaurants/Bars
 - Tables must be 6 feet apart
 - Limit building occupancy to keep physical distancing
 - Limit parties to 10 or fewer
 - Employees must wear cloth face coverings
 - End onsite consumption by 10pm

Guidance Highlights Cont.

- Fitness (gyms, fitness centers, personal training, dance studios, martial arts centers)
 - Limit number of individuals in facility
 - Limit use of equipment to keep 6 feet of distance
 - No contact sports
 - Keep sauna, steam rooms, pools and whirlpool spas closed
 - Screen clients before their session and record client information/date/time of visit



Safely Returning to the Workplace

- Likely in Phase 2

PPE Needs

- Providing medical personal protective equipment (PPE) to healthcare organizations provided they meet eligibility criteria and are responding to the COVID-19 outbreak
- Medical, dental, or other health care offices must supply own PPE for reopening
- KN95 masks are not NIOSH certified (for medical use)
